We came home with a fistful of certificates which we look forward to awarding at our next Assembly. A big thank you to all supporters.

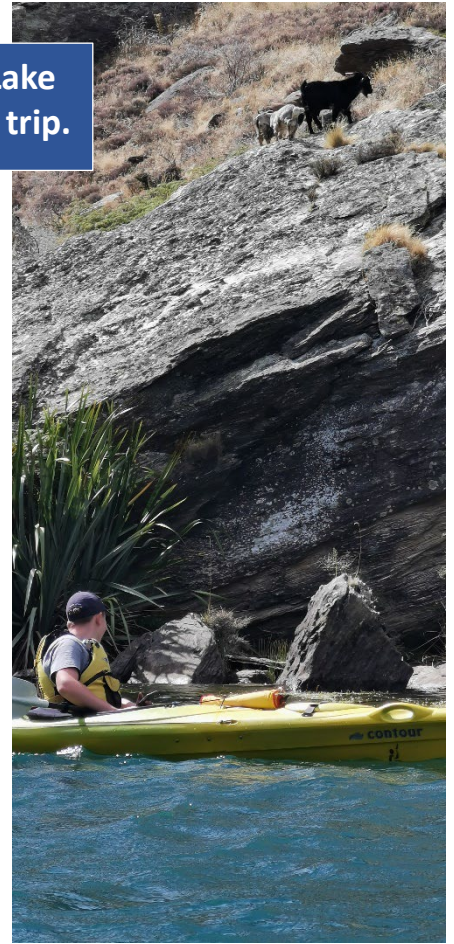
Dunstan Zone Athletics Sports
