## **HEAD STUDENT'S REPORT**


Happy Easter everyone! We hope you're all doing well.





## **New Library Books**


The start of a new year is always a busy time for purchasing new books for our library. There are books being added to our collection almost every month, so make sure you take time to visit our library website to see what's new.


