A belated welcome back to everyone for 2024. The school is humming and we have a wide range of activities happening already. I would like to take the time to welcome our new students to the school. We have 10 new students across the school and all seem to be settling in well.

In terms of staffing we farewell Hannah Sims who has taken a permanent position in Dunedin. We are grateful to have Belinda Milmine step into the teaching role in Room 2. We have a number of internal staffing changes as is normal in a school. Of special note, for the first time in many years, we are running a specialist Year 12 Biology, Physics and Chemistry class with a teacher based in Roxburgh rather than online. We love being able to offer these academic classes to students here at Roxburgh Area School.

Cell Phone Policy

Permission for use:

Please note: Students in Years 1-8 are not permitted cell phones at school.

Students are discouraged from bringing cellphones to school. Recent international research along with feedback from staff and students clearly indicates that cell phones at school are a major distraction for our students. Our policy is designed to ensure that the learning of all students is maximised, while minimising any potential for distraction.

If students in Years 9-13 choose to bring a cell phone, it must be turned off and handed to the nominated teacher at the start of the day. Cell phones will be stored in a secure location and returned at the end of the day. Smart watches are to be set to 'school mode' or similar and not be connected to a cell phone or any other electronic device.

Students who fail to follow this policy will be dealt with following the usual behaviour management approach of the school. Exemptions to this policy must be applied for directly through the Principal.

In an emergency, parents should contact the main office who will quickly convey a message to students. Students falling ill during the day must report to the office, who will contact parents.

Responsibility for cell phones and other devices

Please note, if students do make the decision to bring a cell phone, a media device or any other personal items to the school, they do so at their own risk. Roxburgh Area School is not responsible for any loss or damage caused to any cell phone by themselves or someone else.

Complaints Policy

Purpose

A clearly defined process for handling complaints is essential to ensure members of the whole school community have confidence in the operation of the school and Board of Trustees, and have been dealt with formally.

Objectives

- 1. All complaints from staff, parents, and students will be addressed by the appropriate person. The complainant can address their concern to the teacher and if not satisfied, can then escalate their complaint to the Principal and ultimately the Board.
- 2. The outcome and action taken would be reported to the complainant/s and to the Principal/Board.
- 3. Where a complaint is made it will be responded to within 3 working days to acknowledge it and establish a line of communication.
- 4. Where a complaint is directed in relation to actions of the Principal or dissatisfaction is felt with the manner that the complaint has been handled, the Chairperson of the Board of Trustees should be notified.
- 5. Where a complaint is required to be discussed at a full Board Meeting, those involved have the right to be present. It should be normal procedure for the final discussion and voting on a course of action to be held "in committee".
- 6. If for any reason a "conflict of interest" exists, the trustee concerned should withdraw from the issue. Such withdrawals should be formally recorded in the minutes.
- 7. In dealing with complaints at the Board of Trustees level, the Board should refer to the appropriate employment contract for complaints/disciplinary provisions and where applicable seek legal advice.
- 8. A verbal complaint can be received and acted upon. However, the complainant will be strongly encouraged to put the complaint in writing. The person, who has received the complaint against them, should be informed of the complainant's identity. There may be instances where anonymity of the complainant is required to ensure safety and security of all parties, this will be discussed at the time of the complaint being lodged and reviewed'
- 9. At all times when dealing with a complaint the Principal and Board of Trustees members will maintain full confidentiality, ensure objectivity and fairness and respond in a courteous, frank and honest manner.


The school also has a procedure for addressing concerns. A concern is an issue that parents, staff, or students are unwilling to write down and is not as serious as a formal complaint.
